

China's award of the Confusion Prize to Mugabe will be welcomed by all right-minded Zimbabweans – and, indeed, by our friends around the world. At last the confused leader is getting the recognition he deserves.

The Chinese peace prize was started as an alternative to the Nobel peace prize because the Beijing authorities were annoyed when it was awarded to the imprisoned Chinese dissident Liu Xiaobo. Previous winners of the Chinese peace prize include Russia's President Putin, who is busy waging war against the Ukraine and bombing Syrian opponents of dictator Assad.

The award comes at the right time for Mugabe. It brings in some money which will help the family's struggling milk industry, which apparently has run into 'liquidity' problems. In short, some people have been milking him. Mugabe spoke of mismanagement and 'thievery' and has sacked his general manager. 'Nobody can tell us where the money is', he complained. 'We have hired auditors from Ernst & Young and what they are unearthing is shocking'.

The Zimbabwe Independent says Mugabe suggested that 'corruption was rife because of society's failure to mould upright citizens'. Sounds like sour milk (see: http://www.zimbabwesituation.com/news/zimsit_w_mugabes-dairy-struggles-under-a-us20m-debt-the-zimbabwe-independent/).

But Mugabe shouldn't be too downcast. Zimbabwe is on course for an economic renaissance according to Minister of Industry and Commerce Mike Bimha. 'New dawn for Zim Industries' declares The Herald, which quotes the minister as saying 'Industries in Zimbabwe are beginning to show embryonic signs of firm recovery' (see: <http://www.herald.co.zw/new-dawn-for-zim-industries/>).

The Vigil recently gave a warm welcome to Mr Bimha when he led a delegation of Zimbabwean fraudsters on a mission to gull investors here. We think Mugabe cannot rely on any prediction by him.

Other points

- At the Vigil we discussed our planned protest in Nottingham on Tuesday against the Zimbabwean GP, Dr Sylvester Nyatsuro, now a British citizen having lived here more than ten years, who is trying to take over a farm in Zimbabwe. We will stand outside his clinic demanding to know why a British citizen should think he is entitled to a free farm in starving Zimbabwe, taking it from a Zimbabwean citizen who paid for it, especially as Dr Nyatsuro doesn't live in Zimbabwe and is not a farmer.
- We are sorry to see that, after 11 years, the Zimbabwean is to stop producing a print edition. Zimbabweans owe a great debt to editor Wilf Mbanga and his wife Trish for their long struggle on behalf of the 'voiceless'. We have been encouraged that The Zimbabwean has carried our diary all these years and are glad that it will continue online.
